Etruscans 700-509 BCE


Roman Republic—509-30 BCE (military successes bred more)


Roman Empire —30 BCE-180 CE




Before Rome -- The Etruscan 700-509 BCE

- 1. Anthropomorphic gods
- 2. Romulus and Remus
- 3. Drained marsh that became Forum
- 4. Invented the toga
- 5. Chariot races
- 6. Similar DNA
- 7. Basis of Rome was Etruscan


















Roman Republic—509-30 BCE

- The Republic morphed into Empire
- Effective administrators
- Allowed home-rule in some areas
- · Started out as a citizen army but became professional
- Agribusiness success increased movement to Empire
- · Generals added to the Republic's demise

Roman Empire—30 BCE-180 CE

- Julius Caesar's assassination ushered in Empire
- Pax Romana
- Roman Law—influenced European law (except GB)

Roman Thought

- · Rome didn't produce great thought
- Stoics—happiness is found in acceptance of fate (parallels Buddhism), do your duty

Roman Architecture


- · Aqueducts-provided millions of gallons of water per day

- · Barrel vaults




Pont du Gard c. late 1 st century 100 gal. / inhabitant / day






















Arch of Titus c. 81CE




Interior of Roman building










































The End and the Fall of the Empire

- When did it end—probably 330 AD (Constantine moved to Constantinople)
- 476 AD last western Roman Emperor died
- 402 AD Honorius moved Rome to Ravenna
- · Army's lack of Roman-ness or identity with Rome
- Army chose the emperor and therefore many non Roman emperors
- Other invading armies
- Financial problems
- · Diocletian became god--Christianity got into trouble
- Church "caused" decline





